



**CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE,
LAUDERHILL, TAMARAC
LAUDERDALE LAKES,
AND OAKLAND PARK
BROWARD MOBILITY PROJECT**



Project Overview

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has awarded a \$15 million contract to Construct Group Corp. for the construction of sidewalks, multi-use pedestrian paths, and bicycle lanes along 45 roadways in Broward County. Construction began February 2, 2015 and will be completed in Fall 2018. This project is part of a larger \$100 million investment from the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to provide bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access throughout the Broward region. Project Improvements

Construction along NW 31 Avenue in Fort Lauderdale, Lauderhill, Tamarac, Lauderdale Lakes, and Oakland Park is expected to begin in mid-September 2017 and be completed in late 2017.

Fort Lauderdale and Lauderhill:

NW 31 Ave. from Broward Blvd. to Sunrise Blvd.

- Removing old asphalt and resurfacing the corridor
- Adding 4-5 foot wide bike lanes in each direction

Fort Lauderdale, Lauderhill, Lauderdale Lakes, and Oakland Park:

NW 31 Ave. from Sunrise Blvd. to Oakland Park Blvd.

- Removing old asphalt and resurfacing the corridor
- Adding 4-5 foot wide bike lanes in each direction
- The 45 mph speed limit will be permanently reduced to 35 mph.

Oakland Park, Lauderdale Lakes, Tamarac, and Fort Lauderdale:

NW 31 Ave. from Oakland Park Blvd. to Commercial Blvd.

- Removing old asphalt and resurfacing the corridor
- Adding 4-5 foot wide bike lanes in each direction
- The 45 mph speed limit will be permanently reduced to 35 mph.

Traffic Impact

Single lane closures can be expected Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. and Sunday through Thursday between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m.
