

NW 21ST AVENUE MOBILITY IMPROVEMENT/BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, will widen NW 21st Avenue between Oakland Park Boulevard and Commercial Boulevard and replace the bridge on NW 21st Avenue over the C-13 canal; the cities of Oakland Park, Fort Lauderdale, and Tamarac.

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

The road widening will accommodate 5-foot buffered bike lanes in each direction. The existing bridge over the South Florida Water Management District C-13 Canal will be replaced. Other improvements include upgrading signalization, sidewalk replacement, miscellaneous signage, paving, curb & gutter, and driveway harmonization.



TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Access to residences, businesses, and Oakland Park Fire Station 87 will be maintained at all times
- One lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction during the day
- Lane closures may occur from 9:30 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
- NW 44th Street will be closed periodically at NW 21st Avenue during night operations; traffic will be detoured to NW 39th Street
- NW 39th Street will be closed periodically at NW 21st Avenue during night operations; traffic will be detoured to NW 44th Street
- Lane closure and detour information will be provided in the weekly traffic report distributed by FDOT
