Project personnel will be on hand to discuss the scope of work, construction schedule, and address questions and comments one-on-one. <u>Please note</u>: There will not be a formal presentation. Guests may arrive at any time between 4 p.m. and 6 p.m.

This 3.931-mile project will begin Thursday, Mar. 30, 2017 and is expected to be completed in summer 2018, weather permitting. The construction cost is \$8.5 million. Work is being performed by Ranger Construction Industries, Inc., with AIM Engineering overseeing the project.

Scope of Work:

- Roadway milling and resurfacing
- Drainage installation
- Signing and pavement markings
- Detectable warning devices
- Signalization improvements

Maintenance of Traffic:

In order to do this work safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes at various times and locations. Work will be done in phases to minimize impacts on the community and motoring public.

Project-related lane closures can be expected daily, 9 a.m. until 3:30 p.m., and nightly, 9 p.m. until 6 a.m. Sunday night through Friday morning. Sidewalks may also be closed at various times and locations; however, pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.
