On Wednesday, August 9, 2017, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host an informational Open House for the 17th Street (State Road 656) shoulder widening & resurfacing project from U.S. 1 to 17th Street Causeway Bridge in the City of Vero Beach.

The Open House will be held from 4:00 PM until 6:00 PM at the City of Vero Beach City Hall in the Council Chambers Room, 1053 20th Place, Vero Beach, FL 32960. Project personnel will be on hand to discuss the scope of work, construction schedule, and address questions and comments one-on-one. No formal presentation will be made.

This 0.72-mile project is expected to begin August 18, 2017, with anticipated completion by fall 2018, weather permitting. The cost for construction is \$3.06 million. Work will be performed by Community Asphalt Corporation, with FDOT overseeing the project.

Scope of Work:

- Widening the shoulder along 17th Street from U.S. 1 to 17th Street Causeway Bridge to accommodate 6.5 feet average wide buffered bike lanes in both directions
- Drainage, sidewalk and detectable warning surfaces
- Signalization improvements including installing a new mast arm at the NW corner of 6th Avenue, and upgrading pedestrian detectors
- Milling & resurfacing existing lanes, and striping improvements

Maintenance of Traffic:

Work will be done in phases to minimize traffic impacts. Traffic in either direction along 17th Street will be down to one lane around-the-clock to facilitate drainage & shoulder widening work. Nighttime lane closures will occur for barrier wall installation and paving operations. Sidewalk closures along 17th Street will occur, closing only one side at a time.
