The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) invites the community to a Virtual Public Meeting and In-Person Construction Open House regarding the upcoming SR 7/US 441 RRR Project in Palm Beach County. This project aims to enhance the safety, resiliency, and longevity of the infrastructure for our communities. Please see below for detailed meeting information.

Construction Cost: \$9.5 million Construction Start: July 2025 Anticipated Completion: Late 2026 JOIN US AT THE CONSTRUCTION OPEN HOUSE **PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS** Milling and repaying the existing roadway throughout the Virtual Public Meeting project limits to enhance infrastructure resilience and improve (GoToWebinar) safety for the community. Tuesday, July 15, 2025 Restriping the roadway to provide seven-foot wide bicycle 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. lanes throughout the project limits to enhance cyclist safety.

- Constructing a new six-foot wide sidewalk along the east side of SR 7/US 441 from the West Boca Plaza to Kimberly Boulevard to enhance pedestrian accessibility.
- Upgrading curb ramps and replacing sections of the existing sidewalk to enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians.
- Upgrading pedestrian signals with new LED countdown timers at Kimberly Boulevard, New England Boulevard, CR 794/ Yamato Road, Boca Chase Drive/Boca Gardens Parkway, and Clint Moore Road to enhance pedestrian accessibility.
- Upgrading lighting for pedestrian crosswalks at all signalized intersections for pedestrian and motorist safety.
- Upgrading signage and pavement markings, including installing green bicycle markings at right turn lanes, to enhance visibility and safety.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Work will occur in phases to minimize impacts to the public
- Single lane closures are permitted from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m. Monday through Sunday.
- Double lane closures are permitted nightly from 8:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. Monday through Sunday.
- Milling, repaving, and pavement marking activities are permitted nightly from 8:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. Sunday through Thursday.
- Sidewalk and curb ramp closures will be implemented as needed with temporary pedestrian detours.
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained at all times
