95 Express Lanes Phase 3C—New Traffic Pattern for I-95 Northbound **Managed Lanes**

State Road (SR) 9/I-95 from south of SR 820/Hollywood Boulevard to south of SR 842/Broward Boulevard and SR 862/I-595 from US 441/SR 7 to SR 9/I-95 Financial Project ID Numbers: 409354-2-52-01 and 432222-1-52-01

NEW SR 9/I-95 NORTHBOUND MANAGED LANE TRAFFIC PATTERN:

The SR 9/I-95 northbound managed lanes, which currently end at SR 848/Stirling Road, will be extended approximately 550 feet to just north of SR 818/Griffin Road by Tuesday morning, July 15. This extension enhances lane continuity and safety. Motorists must exit the managed lanes north of SR 820/Hollywood Boulevard to access SR 822/Sheridan Street, SR 848/Stirling Road, or SR 818/Griffin Road. Overhead signage has been updated to reflect the new exit pattern: Local Exits 21-29 & Sheridan St thru Griffin Rd.

- To safely accommodate the extension, northbound SR 9/I-95 will have three inside lanes closed from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. on Sunday night, July 13 and Monday night, July 14, between the SR 820/Hollywood Boulevard managed lanes exit ramp and just north of SR 818/Griffin Road.
- The northbound SR 9/I-95 managed lanes entrance at SR 858/Hallandale Beach Boulevard will also be closed from 9:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. on Sunday night, July 13, and Monday night, July 14. Traffic within the SR 9/I-95 northbound managed lanes will exit at the SR 820/Hollywood Boulevard slip ramp and merge onto the generalpurpose lanes.

Tuesday night, July 15, will be reserved as a contingency night if needed.

The Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) will be on site to assist with traffic control, and detour signage will be in place to guide motorists safely through the area.
