LOXAHATCHEE ROAD IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORT— DECEMBER 2025

The City of Parkland, as the Project Sponsor, received funding through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and requested that FDOT design and construct the Loxahatchee Road Improvements Project through the City of Parkland Resolution Numbers 2016-510, 2021-011, and 2021-018.

CURRENT MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC (MOT)

- **Traffic Impacts:** Eastbound and westbound traffic along Loxahatchee Road has been shifted to the southern lane of Loxahatchee Road from just west of Nob Hill Road to North University Drive to accommodate the construction work zone on the northern portion of the roundabout. Northbound and southbound traffic movements at the intersection of Loxahatchee Road and Nob Hill Road are fully operational as of Nov. 19. To ensure community and public safety, tubular markers have been installed within the double yellow striped lines along Loxahatchee Road in front of the Four Seasons and Watercrest community entrances. Westbound motorists must make their left turn into the communities after passing the tubular markers.
- **Sidewalk Closure:** To ensure pedestrian safety, the sidewalk on Loxahatchee Road between North University Drive and Parkside Drive will be closed for sidewalk and handrail construction.
- **Speed Limit Enforcement:** Motorists are urged to adhere to posted speed limits. Law enforcement will be present throughout the construction period to monitor compliance and maintain safety.
- Additional lane closures, traffic shifts, and detours may be implemented as needed for ongoing construction. Every effort will be made to minimize impacts, and all future closures will be communicated well in advance to keep the community informed.
- **Pedestrians and cyclists are not permitted on Loxahatchee Road at this time.**

ANTICIPATED CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES FOR DECEMBER 2025

North University Drive and Parkside Drive:

- Complete guardrail installation for pedestrian safety.

West of North University Drive and Nob Hill Road:

- Continue construction on the north side of the Nob Hill Road roundabout.
- Asphalt paving on the north side of the Nob Hill Road roundabout.
- Continue placing the base layer for the Loxahatchee Road widening west of Stockholm Boulevard.
- Continue guardrail installation for roadway safety.
