PROJECT OVERVIEW


The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is advancing towards completion of the I-95 Express Phase 3C project in Broward County, with limits from S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard to S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard and along S.R. 862/I-595 from U.S. 441/S.R. 7 to the S.R. 9/I-95 Interchange. This project completes critical links in South Florida's Managed Lanes system by delivering four new direct-connector flyover ramps, two Managed Lanes in each direction of S.R. 9/I-95 and a seamless two way connection between Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach counties.

WHAT HAS BEEN COMPLETED?

- 2 New Direct Connector Fly Over Ramps with movements between S.R. 862/I-595 general -purpose lanes and the S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes:
 - Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 → Westbound S.R. 862/I-595
 - Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 → Westbound S.R. 862/I-595
- Two new continuous Managed Lanes in each direction of S.R. 9/I-95 now provide a seamless connection across South Florida, linking Miami-Dade through Broward and into Palm Beach County.
- New northbound Managed Lanes ingress point open just north of S.R. 822/Sheridan Street.
- New southbound Managed Lanes egress point now open to S.R. 822/Sheridan Street

WHAT'S COMING NEXT

- 2 New Direct Connector Fly Over Ramps with movements to open between eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 general -purpose lanes to S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes:
 - Eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 → Southbound S.R. 9/I-95
 Eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 → Northbound S.R. 9/I-95



The northbound integration phase was completed in early November, marking a major milestone for the I-95 Express Phase 3C project. The southbound integration phase followed in early December, with the remaining two direct-connector ramps set to open soon.

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WHAT DRIVERS NEED TO KNOW



How to Use the New Northbound Connections:

 Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 → Westbound S.R. 862/I-595

Stay in the **far left lane** to access the new **direct-connector fly over ramp**. Follow overhead signs for "I-595 West → I-75/Naples."

 Eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 → Northbound S.R. 9/I-95 - Coming Soon!

Use the **far left inside lane** to enter the new **east-to-north** fly over ramp and merge as signed.

 Northbound Managed Lanes Exit (Located north of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard), servicing S.R 822/Sheridan Street through S.R. 838/Sunrise Boulevard

Motorists needing to access local roads between S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard through S.R. 838/ Sunrise Boulevard, as well as eastbound S.R. 862/I-595, Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport, or Port Everglades, must exit north of S.R. 820/Hollywood Boulevard.

Motorists may also use the Broward Boulevard Park and Ride as an exit to local S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard.

- New Northbound S.R.9/I-95 Managed Lanes
 Entry (Located north of S.R. 822/Sheridan Street)
 Motorists traveling from Local S.R. 858/ Hallandale
 Beach Boulevard through S.R. 822/ Sheridan Street
 will be able to access this new entry point located
 north of S.R. 822/Sheridan Street.
- Safety first: FDOT's top priority is keeping motorists safe. Drivers are urged to use caution and follow all posted signage, including overhead signs and dynamic message boards.

How to Use the New Southbound Connections:

 Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 → Westbound S.R. 862/I-595

Stay in the **far left lane** to access the new **direct-connector fly over ramp**. Follow overhead signs for **"I-595 West → I-75/Naples."**

Eastbound S.R. 862/I-595 → Southbound
 S.R. 9/I-95 - Coming Soon!

Use the **far left inside lane** to enter the new **east-to-south** fly over ramp and merge as signed.

 New Southbound Managed Lanes Exit (Located north of S.R. 822/Sheridan Street), servicing S.R. 822/Sheridan Street through S.R. 824/Pembroke Road

Motorists needing to access local roads between S.R. 838/Sunrise Boulevard through S.R. 848/ Stirling Road, as well as eastbound S.R. 862/I-595, Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport, or Port Everglades, must exit at S.R. 816/Oakland Park Boulevard.

Motorists may also use the Broward Boulevard Park and Ride as an exit to local S.R. 842/Broward Boulevard.

- Southbound S.R. 9/I-95 Managed Lanes Entrance (South of S.R. 822/Sheridan Street) servicing S.R. 838/Sunrise Boulevard through S.R. 848/Stirling Road
- Managed Lanes Rules

Standard vehicle eligibility and posted Managed Lanes rules apply.

Watch for overhead EXPRESS signs marking the slip-ramp locations and lane eligibility.

Bridge construction, roadway widening, and early works.

Northbound integration, direct connector openings, and final northbound tie-ins. Southbound integration, direct connector opening, and final managed lane tie-ins. Final system commissioning and SunPass toll activation.

TOLLING STATUS



SunPass tolling will activate after commissioning of the new segments. During the rollout, tolling on newly opened segments and direct connectors may remain at \$0.00 until corresponding southbound segments are integrated. When tolling begins, overhead signs will identify entry/exit points and display all-electronic toll amounts.
