FULL RAMP CLOSURE ON EASTBOUND 1-595 TO EXIT RAMP FOR FLORIDA TURNPIKE (EXIT 8) IS TO BE CLOSED ON SELECT NIGHTS BEGINNING SUNDAY, **NOVEMBER 16, 2025 THROUGH TUESDAY, NOVEMBER** 18, 2025—Full Ramp Closure on Eastbound I-595 to Exit Ramp for Florida Turnpike (Exit 8) is to be closed on select nights beginning Sunday, November 16, 2025 through Tuesday, November 18, 2025 from 9:00pm to 5:00am. This closure is necessary to safely perform milling and resurfacing operations. The detour will accommodate motorists who would normally exit at Exit 8 to access the Northbound Florida Turnpike. Instead, motorists will continue east on State Road 84. merge onto Northbound US-441, then turn left onto Sunrise Boulevard and travel west to reach the Northbound Turnpike entrance. The detour will also accommodate motorists who would normally exit at Exit 8 to access the Southbound Florida Turnpike. Instead, motorists will continue east on State Road 84, merge onto Southbound US-441, and follow the detour signs to Griffin Road to access the Southbound Turnpike. Ongoing milling and resurfacing activities may be impacted by weather conditions. Please use caution in the area and follow all posted detour signs.

In addition to ongoing maintenance activities, the I-595 Resurfacing Project began on Sunday, June 22, 2025. This project includes repaving the I-595 corridor—encompassing the Express Lanes, general-purpose lanes, and State Road 84—to improve the durability and resilience of the roadway. It also involves upgrading signage and pavement markings to meet current standards and enhancing the pavement surface for a smoother, safer driving experience. All work is being performed during nighttime hours to minimize impacts on daytime traffic. Updates on lane closures and project progress will continue to be shared as work advances.

CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION:

- Anticipated Resurfacing End: March 2029
- Work will be done during off-season periods over the next four years.
- Estimated Resurfacing Cost: \$20M
