


FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION 1 595 Resurfacing Project Closure Notice 1-595 CORRIDOR RESURFACING PROJECT | PHASE I

I 595 and State Road 84 from I-75 to I-95, including Florida's Turnpike interchange areas Financial Project ID: 420809-3-52-01

FULL RAMP CLOSURE ON WESTBOUND 595/WESTBOUND STATE ROAD 84 AND NORTHBOUND/SOUTHBOUND US-441 TO EXIT OFF RAMP TO SOUTHBOUND TURNPIKE IS TO BE CLOSED ON SELECT NIGHTS BEGINNING WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 19, 2025 THROUGH THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 20, 2025— This closure is necessary to safely perform milling and resurfacing operations. Drivers traveling west on State Road 84, southbound or northbound on US-441, or westbound on I-595 who intend to access the Turnpike southbound will need to continue west, loop around Davie Road, then head east to merge onto US-441 southbound. From there, they will follow Orange Drive west to reach the Turnpike southbound entrance. This detour also applies to motorists traveling east on SR-84 who are unable to use Exit 8 to merge onto Turnpike southbound; they will need to follow the same detour described above. Ongoing milling and resurfacing activities may be impacted by weather conditions. Please use caution in the area and follow all posted detour signs.

In addition to ongoing maintenance activities, the I-595 Resurfacing Project began on Sunday, June 22, 2025. This project includes repaving the I-595 corridor—encompassing the Express Lanes, general-purpose lanes, and State Road 84—to improve the durability and resilience of the roadway. It also involves upgrading signage and pavement markings to meet current standards and enhancing the pavement surface for a smoother, safer driving experience. All work is being performed during nighttime hours to minimize impacts on daytime traffic lindates on lane closures and project progress will continue to be shared as work advances.



CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION:

- Anticipated Resurfacing End: March 2029
- Work will be done during off-season periods over the next four years.
- Estimated Resurfacing Cost: \$20M
