LOXAHATCHEE ROAD BETWEEN PARKSIDE DRIVE AND U.S. 441/S.R. 7 TO CLOSE JAN. 12, 2026 THROUGH FALL 2026

To ensure community and public safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, Loxahatchee Road from Parkside Drive to U.S. 441/S.R. 7 will be closed to traffic for phased construction improvements. This closure will be in effect from Jan. 12, 2026 through Fall 2026. During this full closure, traffic will be detoured via Parkside Drive, Holmberg Road and U.S. 441/S.R. 7. Local access to businesses and residential properties along Loxahatchee Road will be maintained at all times throughout construction. As part of phase 1 improvements, properties west of NW 61st Way will continue to be accessed via Parkside Drive. Signage will be in place to assist motorists through the detour.



Construction Cost: \$33,480,584

Construction Start Date: October 30, 2023

Anticipated Completion: Early 2027

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

The project improvements consist of widening the road to accommodate bike lanes, creating a continuous sidewalk on the south side of the road, constructing roundabouts at Nob Hill Road, SR 817/N University Drive, and Parkside Drive, adding an additional eastbound left turn lane onto SR 7/US 441, milling and resurfacing the roadway, and upgrading signage and pavement markings.
