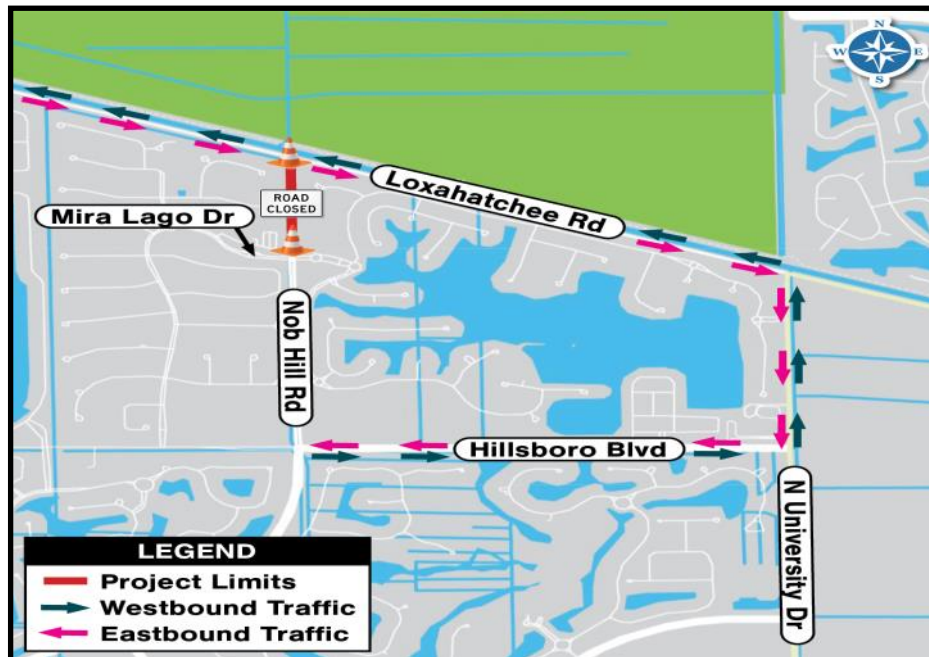
NOB HILL ROAD AT LOXAHATCHEE ROAD WILL BE CLOSED BEGINNING MONDAY, OCT. 13 THROUGH FRIDAY NOV. 21

To ensure community and public safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, Nob Hill Road at Loxahatchee Road will be closed at 7 a.m. on Monday, Oct. 13, through Friday Nov. 21, for roundabout construction.

During the full closure traffic will be detoured via N University Drive, Hillsboro Boulevard, and Nob Hill Road. Access to residential properties along Nob Hill Road will be maintained at all times throughout construction.

To ensure overall safety, FDOT urges motorists to use precaution as they travel through the area. Pedestrian and cyclist access will also continue to be restricted.
