### SR 7/US 441 Transit Corridor Improvements Project (Group 6)

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is pleased to provide information regarding the SR 7/US 441 Transit Corridor Improvements Project (Group 6) along Kimberly Boulevard from SW 81<sup>st</sup> Avenue to SW 69<sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW 10<sup>th</sup> Court to SR 7/US 441, along SW 11<sup>th</sup> Street from SR 7/US 441 to SW 49<sup>th</sup> Terrace, and along Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard/Hammondville Road from NW 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue to NW 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue. This project aims to enhance the safety, resiliency, and longevity of the infrastructure for our communities. Please see below for detailed information.

The cities of Margate, North Lauderdale, and Pompano Beach as the Project Sponsors, received funding through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and requested that FDOT District Four design and construct the SR 7/US 441 Transit Corridor Improvements Project (Group 6) through the City of Margate Resolution No. 23-065, through the City of North Lauderdale Resolution No. 20-06-6764, and through the City of Pompano Beach Resolution No. 2023-53. The Broward MPO is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward County and this project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access. The Broward MPO is a federally mandated agency that is responsible for making decisions on local transportation issues and deciding how to spend federal funds on transportation projects within Broward County. ### PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

#### ***Kimberly Boulevard from SW 81<sup>st</sup> Avenue to SW 69<sup>th</sup> Avenue and from SW 10<sup>th</sup> Court to SR 7/US 441***

- Milling and resurfacing the roadway within the project limits to ensure long-term infrastructure resilience
- Upgrading existing pedestrian signals at signalized intersections within the project limits to improve push button accessibility
- Modifying the median to extend the eastbound left turn lane at SR 7/US 441 for additional vehicular storage capacity
- Upgrading curb ramps, pavement markings, and signage within the project limits to improve visibility and accessibility

#### ***SW 11<sup>th</sup> Street from SR 7/US 441 to SW 49<sup>th</sup> Terrace***

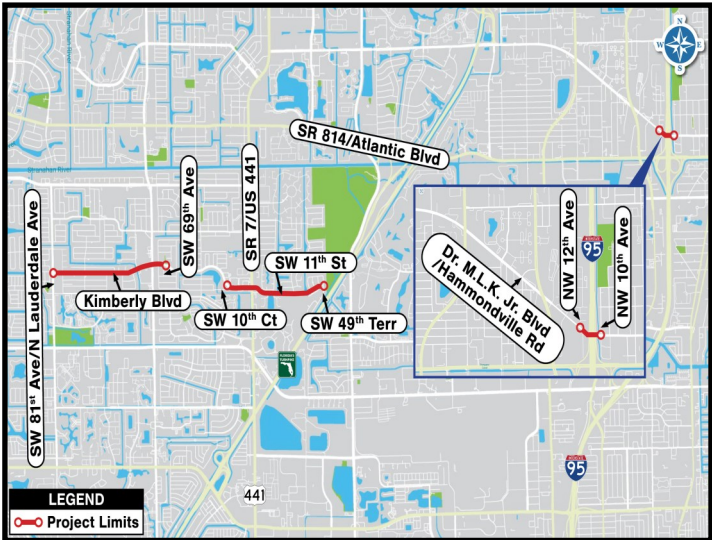
- Milling and resurfacing the roadway from SR 7/US 441 to the Oakland Hills Apartments' west entrance to ensure long-term infrastructure resilience
- Modifying the median to extend the westbound left turn lane at SR 7/US 441 for additional vehicular storage capacity
- Adding a continuous concrete sidewalk from east of SW 55<sup>th</sup> Avenue to west of 50<sup>th</sup> Avenue for pedestrian connectivity
- Upgrading curb ramps, pavement markings, and signage within the project limits to improve visibility and accessibility

#### ***Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard/Hammondville Road from NW 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue to NW 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue***

- Milling and resurfacing the roadway within the project limits to ensure long-term infrastructure resilience
- Minor roadway widening within the project limits to accommodate bicycle lanes in both directions
- Upgrading the existing lighting under the SR 9/I-95 bridge to enhance nighttime visibility

### TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Single lane closures along Kimberly Boulevard, SW 11<sup>th</sup> Street, and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard/Hammondville Road are permitted daily as needed, 8:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m.
- Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard/Hammondville Road will be reduced to a single lane in each direction for roadway widening and drainage operations
- Motorist and pedestrian access to businesses and residences will be maintained at all times
