TRAFFIC IMPACTS

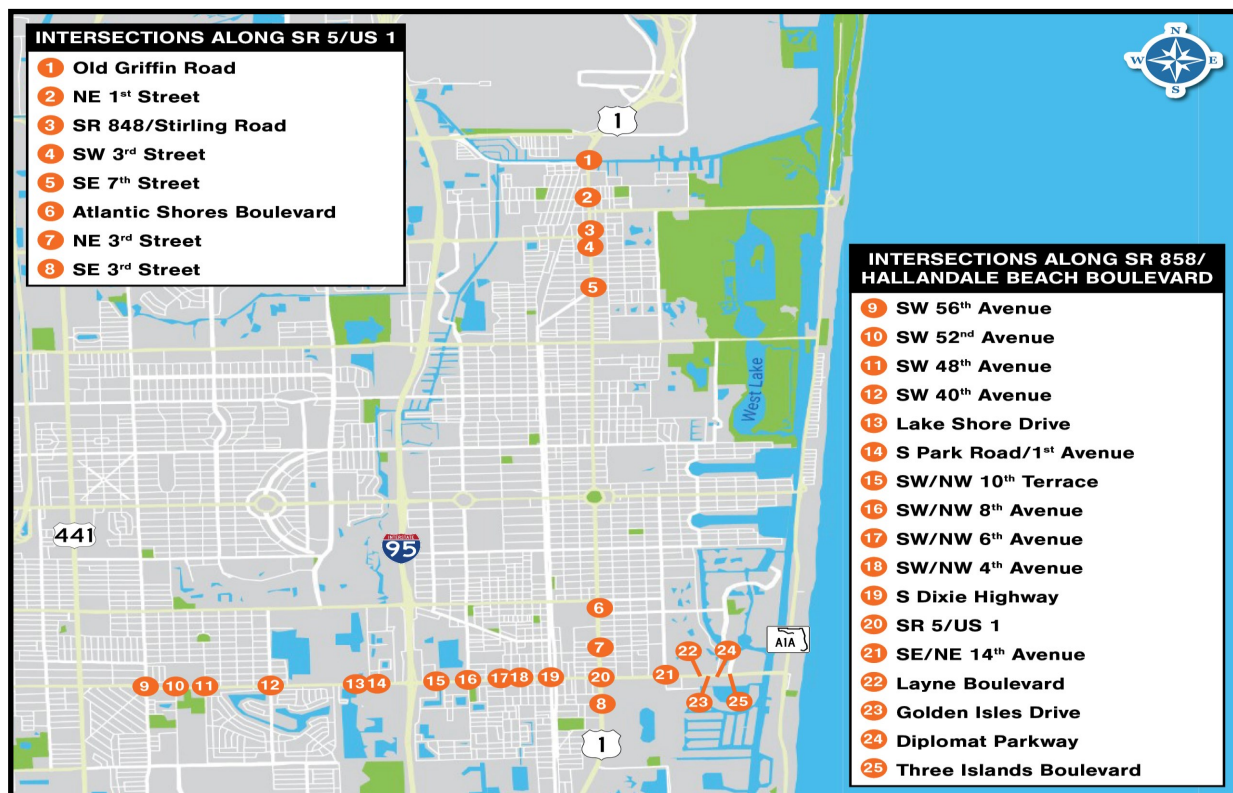
- Lane closures are permitted nightly on SR 5/US 1 between 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.
