QUEUE DETECTION SYSTEM PILOT PROJECT AT FOUR STATE ROAD RAIL CROSSINGS

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is pleased to provide information regarding the Queue Detection System Pilot Project at four state road crossings along the South Florida Rail Corridor (SFRC). The four state road railroad crossings are located at SR 882/Forest Hill Boulevard in Palm Beach County and SR 870/Commercial Boulevard, SR 820/Hollywood Boulevard, and SR 858/Hallandale Beach Boulevard in Broward County.

The project includes testing of detectors and closed circuit television (CCTV) cameras to identify vehicular queues near railroad crossings to be able to transmit messages to connected vehicles and warn drivers about potential conflicts. The project aims to test smart technologies to help improve safety for all roadway users near railroad crossings. The CCTV cameras will be used to verify the vehicular detector is operating as intended and provide additional coverage at the four proposed locations to aid incident management at these locations. This system will additionally enhance the existing ‘DO NOT STOP ON TRACKS’ flashing beacons at the crossings.

Construction Cost: \$827,827 Construction Start: February 2024 Estimated Completion: Summer 2025

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Installing fiber optic cable, Road Side Units (RSU), video detectors, and closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras at the following SFRC railroad crossings:
 - SR 882/Forest Hill Boulevard
 - SR 870/Commercial Boulevard
 - SR 820/Hollywood Boulevard
 - SR 858/Hallandale Beach Boulevard
