The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four, is pleased to provide information for the SR 93/I-75 from Sheridan Street to South of I-595 Resurfacing Project in Broward County.

Construction Cost: \$7,949,000

Construction Start: August 2, 2021

Estimated Completion: Summer 2022

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Milling and resurfacing along SR 93/I-75 between Sheridan Street and south of I-595
- Installing guardrail and double-face guardrail throughout the project limits
- Installing signs and flashing beacons to alert wrong way drivers at the SR 93/I-75 southbound exit ramp to Griffin Road

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Lane closures on SR 93/I-75 are permitted between 7:30 p.m. and 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday night. One lane of SR 93/I-75 can close at 7:30 p.m., two lanes can close at 9 p.m., and three lanes can close at 10 p.m., until 6 a.m. To ensure motorist safety, access to the Managed Lanes may be restricted during these closures.
- SR 93/I-75 entrance and exit ramp closures are permitted between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday night.
- Additional information about lane closures and detour information will be provided in the weekly traffic report distributed by FDOT.

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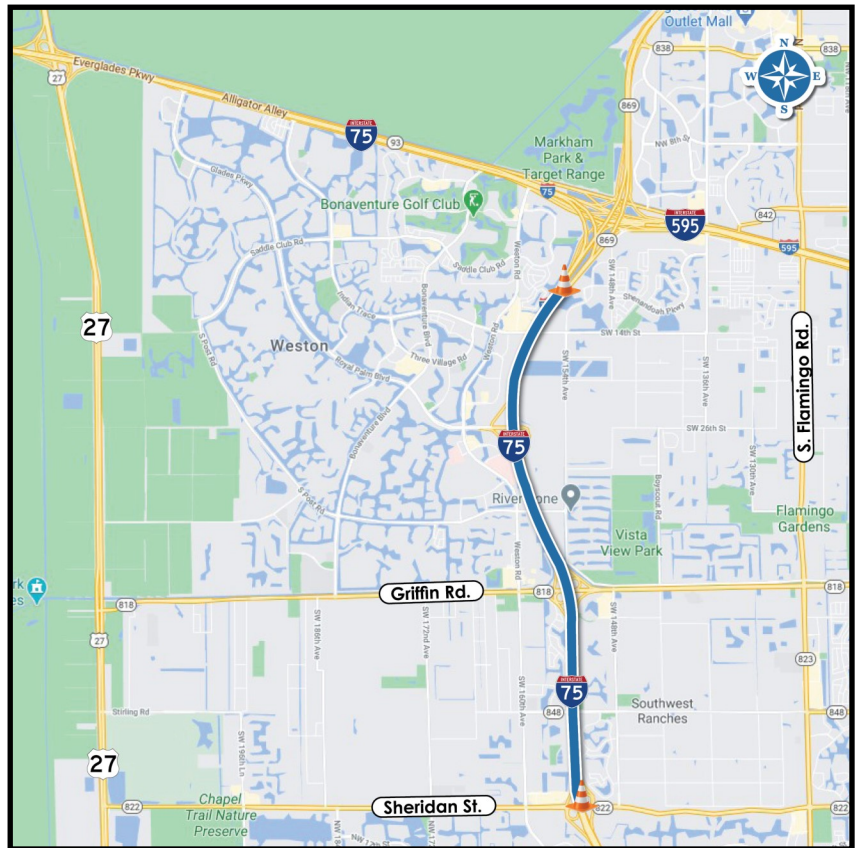
