The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, is pleased to provide information regarding the roadway improvements at the intersection of SR 817/University Drive and Johnson Street in the City of Pembroke Pines.

Construction Cost: \$436,772.47

Construction Start: January 25, 2022

Estimated Completion: Summer 2022

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Upgrading 2 existing light poles to LED
- Installing 3 new light poles
- Milling and resurfacing at the Intersection
- Reconstructing medians on SR 817/University Drive south of Johnson Street to NW 11th Street
- Replacing signing and pavement markings

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Single lane closures are permitted weekdays between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.
- Double lane closures are permitted Monday through Saturday 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Access to businesses will be maintained at all times.
- Additional lane closure information will be provided in the Weekly Traffic Report distributed by FDOT.

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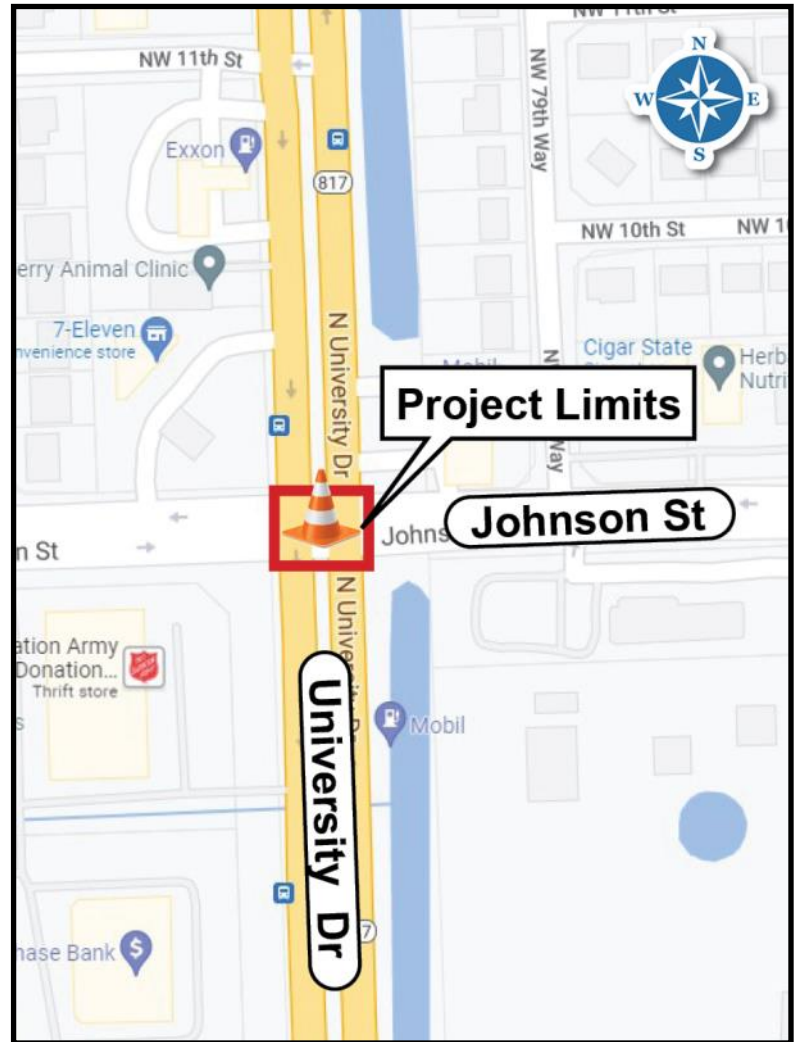
