PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

 Installing gabion mattress for scour prevention along the canal bottom and side slopes to protect the bridge foundation.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Lane closures may occur 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m., Sunday through Saturday.
- Lane closures will be limited to one direction of traffic at a time.

MARINE TRAFFIC IMPACTS

 Half-channel closures can be expected for sediment containment, during construction operations. Access will be maintained at all times.
