### **SR A1A BRIDGE PROJECT**

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, is pleased to provide information regarding the erosion prevention measures on the State Road A1A Bridge over the Hillsboro Inlet in the City of Pompano Beach.

Construction Cost: \$1.8 million Construction Start Date: February 26, 2022 Anticipated Completion: Late 2022

#### PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Installing articulated concrete blocks (ACB) for erosion prevention within the navigable channel and bridge foundation
- Removing and replacing the existing bicycle plates
- Removing and replacing the underwater cabling system

### TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Single lane closures in each direction may occur at anytime, Monday through Friday.
- Full closures may occur along North Riverside Drive at anytime, Monday through Friday. Detour route will be implemented as needed.
- Pedestrian traffic will not be impacted.
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained at all times.

## **MARINE TRAFFIC IMPACTS**


 Half-Channel closures can be expected for sediment containment, during construction operations. Access will be maintained at all times.
