## NW 136<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE AND SR-84 INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS



### Overnight Full Closure along Westbound SR 84 at SW 136<sup>th</sup> Avenue Will Occur February 21 and February 22

Westbound SR 84, just east of SW 136<sup>th</sup> Avenue, will be closed overnight on Sunday, February 21 through Monday, February 22 between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m., for milling and resurfacing. Traffic will be detoured as follows: the slip ramp from westbound SR 84 to westbound I-595, then via right lane to westbound SR 84, and a U-turn at Weston Road to eastbound SR 84.

This project scope includes replacing and widening the existing bridge over the North New River Canal, resulting in an additional southbound through lane and designated bike lanes; adding a designated right-turn lane from westbound SR 84 to northbound NW 136<sup>th</sup> Avenue; upgrading existing lighting to LED; and milling and resurfacing the roadway.
