STATE ROAD (SR) 7 TRANSIT CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS Group 6

The project consists of three separate segments within three cities in Broward County to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access:

- Kimberly Boulevard from SW 81 Avenue to SR 7 in North Lauderdale
- SW 11 Street from SR 7 TO SW 49 Terrace in Margate
- Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard from NW 12 Avenue to NW 10 Avenue in Pompano Beach Financial Project ID: 429576-6-52-01

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, will conduct three public meetings regarding the proposed SR 7 Transit Corridor Improvements. There will be one virtual meeting and two in-person public meetings. The public meetings will have representatives available to answer questions. PROJECT PURPOSE

The purpose of this project is to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access.

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

Kimberly Boulevard- North Lauderdale From SW 81 Avenue to SR 7

- Install bike lanes by repurposing outside traffic lane.
- Upgrade the existing sidewalks and ramps as needed to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.

SW 11 Street - Margate From SR 7 TO SW 49 Terrace

- Construct the missing sidewalks from east of SW 55
 Avenue to the west of 50 Avenue and upgrade ramps as needed to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.
- Extend west bound left turn lane at SR 7.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. - Pompano Beach From NW 12 Avenue to NW 10 Avenue

- Widen roadway to install bicycle lanes.
- Modify drainage to accommodate the bicycle lanes.
- Install pedestrian lighting under the I-95 bridge.

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

- Work will be scheduled in phases to reduce the effects of construction on the community.
- Temporary lane closures will take place during nonpeak hours to reduce the impact on the public.
- Access to businesses and private properties will be maintained during construction.

Construction Start Date: Fall 2024
 Anticipated Completion: Spring 2025
 Construction Cost Estimate: \$4.5 Million
