The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four, is pleased to provide information for the I-95 Landscape Improvements Project in Broward County.

Construction Cost: \$1,322,302

Construction Start: May 3, 2021

Estimated Completion: Spring 2022

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Installing plants throughout the project limits, including several species of palms and shade trees
- Installing a temporary irrigation system

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Shoulder closures will be used to unload equipment and materials safely along I-95.
- The northbound right-turn lane at the Andrews Avenue exit to the Park and Ride lot will be closed Monday through Friday, between 9 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.
- Additional lane closure information will be provided in the Weekly Traffic Report distributed by FDOT.

MAINTENANCE

- Upon completion of the installation (construction) phase of the project in Spring 2022, the contractor will maintain the temporary irrigation and landscaping for two years before transferring the maintenance to FDOT.

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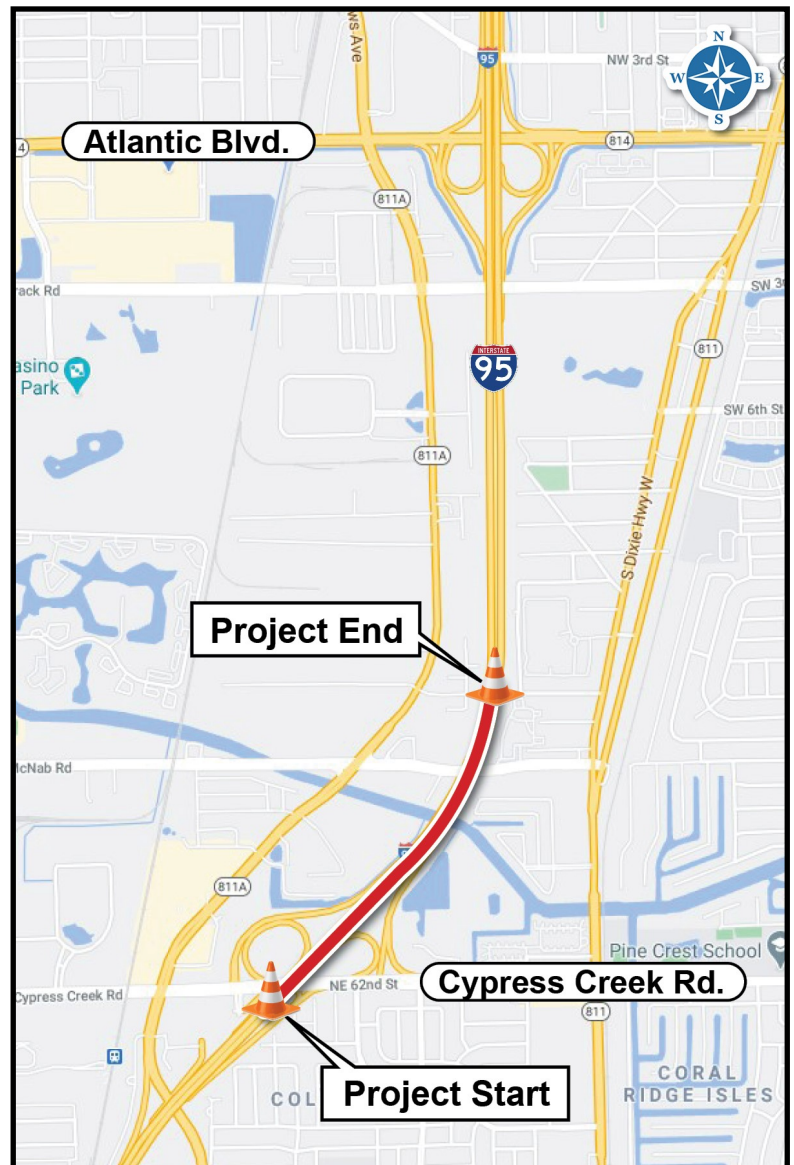
