- Painting of all steel bridge components
- Painting of the movable span piers, traffic and pedestrian concrete railing, and control house
- All painting will match existing colors

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Full closure of the SR A1A/SE 17th Street
 Causeway bridge is only permitted one direction at a time, as needed, 10:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.,
 Sunday through Thursday.
- Sidewalk closures will be implemented as needed and pedestrians will be detoured.
