# I-95 AT DAVIE BOULEVARD INTERCHANGE SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, will be implementing safety enhancements at the I-95 and Davie Boulevard Interchange in the City of Fort Lauderdale.

### PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Upgrading signalization and lighting at the I-95 and Davie Boulevard Interchange.
- Installing overhead signs for the I-95 northbound and southbound exit ramps.
- Milling and resurfacing of the existing pavement on the I-95 northbound and southbound off ramps.
- Milling and resurfacing of the existing pavement on Davie Boulevard, just west and east of the I-95 Interchange.

### TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Overnight single lane closures will occur on Davie Boulevard between 8:30 p.m. and 7:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- Overnight full lane closures will occur on the I-95 northbound and southbound off ramps to Davie Boulevard between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- Intermittent full closures of the I-95 northbound or southbound off ramps is only expected during certain operations.
  Detours will occur as necessary.
- \* Additional lane closure and detour information will be provided in the weekly traffic report distributed by FDOT.
