LOXAHATCHEE ROAD MOBILITY IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a Virtual Public Meeting and In-Person Construction Open House regarding the upcoming mobility improvements along Loxahatchee Road from the Arthur R. Marshall Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge to SR 7/US 441 in the City of Parkland. Please see below for detailed meeting information.

The City of Parkland, as the Project Sponsor, received funding through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and requested that FDOT District Four design and construct the Loxahatchee Road Mobility Improvements Project through the City of Parkland Resolution Numbers 2016-510, 2021-011, and 2021-018. The Broward MPO is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward County and this project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access. The Broward MPO is a federally mandated agency that is responsible for making decisions on local transportation issues and deciding how to spend federal funds on transportation projects within Broward County. Construction Start Date: November 2023 Construction Cost: \$33,480,584 **Anticipated Completion:** Late 2026

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Widening the road to accommodate bike lanes
- Creating a continuous sidewalk on the south side of the road
- Constructing roundabouts at Nob Hill Road, University Drive, and Parkside Drive
- Adding an additional eastbound left turn lane onto SR 7/US 441
- Milling and resurfacing the roadway
- Upgrading signage and pavement markings

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- West of Parkside Drive: Lane closures are permitted nightly, Monday through Friday, between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- East of Parkside Drive: work to occur during the day to reduce noise impacts overnight
- Periodic directional closures with detours will be required
- Motorist and pedestrian access to businesses and residences will be maintained at all times
- Additional information about lane closures, detours, and pedestrian access will be provided in the weekly traffic report distributed by FDOT and can be viewed using the
