SR 7/US 441 Mobility Improvements Project Along Prospect Road

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, is pleased to provide information for the SR-7/US-441 Mobility Improvement Project along Prospect Road in the cities of North Lauderdale, Fort Lauderdale, and Tamarac. The City of Tamarac, the City of North Lauderdale, and Broward County, as the Project Sponsors, requested through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) that FDOT, District Four, design and construct the SR-7/US-441 Mobility Improvement Project along Prospect Road through the City of Tamarac Resolution 2019-52, the City of Nort Lauderdale Resolution 18-12-6583, and Broward County Resolution 2019-286.

The Broward MPO is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward County and this project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access. The Broward MPO is a federally-mandated agency responsible for setting policy on local transportation issues and deciding how to spend federal and state funding on transportation projects in the Broward region. Construction Cost: \$6.7 Million

Construction Start: September 2022

Estimated Completion: Fall 2023

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Widening the roadway to accommodate buffered bicycle lanes in both directions.
- Constructing new sidewalks along the south side of Prospect Road from SR-7/US-441 to NW 31st Avenue and along both sides of Prospect Road from NW 31st Avenue to SR-870/Commercial Boulevard.
- Upgrading signage and pavement markings.
- Milling and resurfacing within the project limits.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Lane closures may occur between 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., weekdays and weekends.
- Lane closures may occur between 9:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. during milling, resurfacing, and striping operations.
- Pedestrian detours will be in place during sidewalk closures.
- Business and residential access will be maintained at all times throughout construction.
