PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

- · Restriping to accommodate bike lanes
- Widening to add a right-turn lane to Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School
- Upgrade pedestrian signals, pavement markings, and signing to latest standards
- Resurface pavement

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

- During paving operations, one direction of Holmberg Road will be closed and detoured via Trails End
- Access to schools will be maintained at all times
- No sidewalk closures or roadway detours are allowed during school hours
