STATE ROAD 838/SUNRISE BOULEVARD INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, is pleased to provide information about the proposed improvements at the intersection of SR 838/Sunrise Boulevard and NW 16th Avenue in the City of Fort Lauderdale.

PROJECT IMPROVEMENT

- Upgrading traffic signals to mast arms at the northwest and southeast quadrants
- Upgrading the existing intersection lighting
- Improving the eastbound right-turn radius at the southwest quadrant
- Reconstructing sidewalks at the southwest and southeast quadrants of the intersection
- Milling and resurfacing, installing signage, pavement markings and improving drainage

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Lane closures may occur: 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., Monday through Friday 8:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m., Sunday through Thursday
- Pedestrian detours will be in place during sidewalk closures
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained at all times.
