

SR-9/I-95 SOUTHBOUND AT SR-84 WILL HAVE A NEW TRAFFIC PATTERN BEGINNING THURSDAY, NOV. 17

SR-9/I-95 southbound lanes, from just north of SR-84/Marina Mile Boulevard to just south of SR-862/I-595, will be placed into a new temporary traffic configuration beginning 5 a.m., Thursday, Nov. 17 to accommodate construction activities associated with the future I-95 and I-595 direct connector bridges as part of [95 Express Phase 3C](#). The four I-95 southbound lanes will be split by a work zone; two lanes will be maintained on each side. Motorists traveling on I-95 southbound wishing to access SR-818/Griffin Road will utilize the outside lane. Overhead Dynamic Message Signs and additional signage will be in place to advise motorists. To safely implement the new temporary traffic configuration, crews will close three lanes overnight Wednesday, Nov. 16. The first lane will close at 9 p.m., the second lane will close at 10 p.m., and three lanes will be closed by 11 p.m.. All lanes will reopen by 5:30 a.m. As a contingency, Thursday night, Nov. 16 will be used as needed. FHP will be onsite to assist motorists throughout implementation.



This project will extend the existing Managed Lanes North from just south of Hollywood Boulevard to just south of Broward Boulevard in Broward County. One lane will be added and the High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lane will be converted to create two Managed Lanes in each direction. The number of General Use lanes will remain the same. Other project improvements include construction of I-95/I-595 Direct Connectors between the I-95 Managed Lanes and I-595, as well as reconstruction, milling, resurfacing, and widening of I-595 from SR-7 to I-95 and along I-95 from south of Hollywood Boulevard to south of Broward Boulevard. Additional work includes bridge widening along I-95 at several locations, painting of 17 bridges within project limits, I-95/SR 84 interchange modifications, Integrated Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) Installation, including traffic monitoring devices, detectors, and dynamic message signs to optimize traffic operations, tolling/gantry construction, ramp signalization implementation at the interchanges, lighting, signage, and drainage Installation and construction of shoulder-mounted sound walls and retaining walls.
