SR A1A Mobility Improvements Project

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four is pleased to provide information regarding the mobility improvements along SR A1A in the City of Deerfield Beach and Town of Hillsboro Beach.

The Broward MPO is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward County and this project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access. The Broward MPO is a federally-mandated agency responsible for setting policy on local transportation issues and deciding how to spend Federal and State funding on transportation projects in the Broward region. Construction Cost: \$6,377,643 **Construction Start:** June 17, 2022 **Estimated Completion:** Summer 2023

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Milling and resurfacing the existing travel lanes
- Widening the roadway to accommodate designated bike lanes
- Adding a sidewalk along the west side of the roadway between Opal Towers and SE 10th Street
- Upgrading existing mid-block pedestrian crossings with Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon Signs
- Raising the roadway elevation from 900 Hillsboro Mile to south of Le Baron Apartments

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- For the Town of Hillsboro Beach, single lane closures are permitted weekdays, between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m.
- For the City of Deerfield Beach, single lane closures are permitted weekdays, between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., and Saturdays, between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m.
- Pedestrian detours will be in place during sidewalk closures, as needed.
- Business and residential access will be maintained at all times throughout construction.
