SR-5/US-1/FEDERAL HIGHWAY MOBILITY IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, will host a Virtual Public Meeting and in-person Construction Open House regarding the upcoming mobility improvements along SR-5/US-1/Federal Highway from SR-824/Pembroke Road to SR-822/Sheridan Street in the City of Hollywood. Please see below for detailed meeting information.

The City of Hollywood, as the Project Sponsor, received funding through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and requested that FDOT District Four design and construct the SR-5/US-1/Federal Highway Mobility Improvements Project through the City of Hollywood Resolution No. R-CRA 2015-56. The Broward MPO is investing over \$300 million to create safer, healthier communities in Broward County and this project is one of many within a larger plan to create enhanced bicycle, pedestrian, and public transportation access. The Broward MPO is a federally mandated agency that is responsible for making decisions on local transportation issues and deciding how to spend federal funds on transportation projects within Broward County. 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PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Milling and resurfacing along the project limits
- Modifying pavement markings along SR-5/US-1/Federal Highway to accommodate 4-foot bicycle lanes in each direction
- Installing 138 new light poles and upgrading existing lighting to LED along the corridor
- Replacing concrete sidewalk with pavers from Monroe Street to Van Buren Street, and from Polk Street to Fillmore Street
- Removing existing pavers at signalized intersections between Van Buren Street and SR-824/Pembroke Road
- Installing decorative stamped asphalt crosswalks at all signalized intersections

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Lane closures are permitted Sunday through Thursday, between 10:30 p.m. and 7:30 a.m. and two-hour single lane closures are permitted between 7:30am to 3:00pm for concrete pours.
- Full side street closures are permitted on weekends for the construction of the decorative crosswalks.
- Business, pedestrian, and residential access will be maintained at all times.
