SR 706/ INDIANTOWN ROAD LANE CLOSURES TO OCCUR FOR MAST ARM INSTALLATION

JUPITER– Beginning next week, there will be several closures temporary lane closures on S.R. 706/ Indiantown Road for final mast arm installation, for approximately three days, Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Officials report.

The western-most exit of Jupiter West Plaza (adjacent to I-HOP) will be closed. Motorists are being asked to exit at Island Way, located on the west end of the plaza. The northeast corner of Central Boulevard and Indiantown Road will be closed. The right turn lane will be affected. The northwest corner of Central Boulevard and Indiantown Road will be closed.
