NORTH SHORE DRIVE OVER THE CARVER CANAL WILL BE CLOSED MAY 15-18

Beginning 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, May 15, the North Shore Drive Bridge over the Carver Canal, from 39th Street to 43rd Street, will be closed in both directions to install the prefabricated pedestrian bridge on its foundations. The closure will be in effect around the clock through 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, May 18. If weather or unforeseen impacts delay operations, the closure may be extended through Monday, May 19.

- Motorists traveling northbound on North Shore Drive will be detoured east to 39th Street, north on Australian Avenue, west to 43rd Street, and north to North Shore Drive.
- Motorists traveling southbound on North Shore Drive will be detoured east to 43rd Street, south on Australian Avenue, west to 39th Street, and south to North Shore Drive.
- Access for emergency and first responder vehicles will be maintained and coordinated throughout the closure. Access to residences and businesses will also be maintained. Signage will be posted to guide all roadway users accordingly.
