



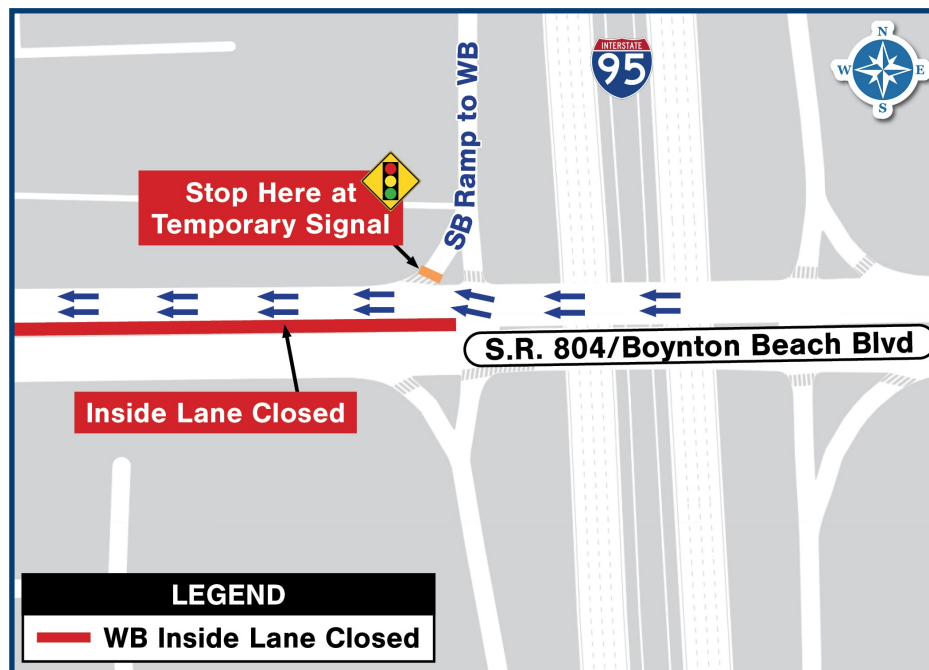

I-95 SOUTHBOUND EXIT RAMP TO WESTBOUND BOYNTON BEACH BOULEVARD — TEMPORARY CHANGE IN TRAFFIC PATTERN BEGINNING IN EARLY JANUARY 2026

Beginning Sunday night, January 4, 2026, bridge repairs are expected to begin on Boynton Beach Boulevard over the SFRTA Railroad and will continue until Early Spring 2026. These repairs are required prior to starting bridge widening operations as part of the I-95 interchange improvements project.

- **Temporary Change in Traffic Pattern:** During this time, the I-95 southbound exit ramp to Boynton Beach Boulevard will not have a free-flowing right turn lane onto westbound Boynton Beach Boulevard. All traffic on the I-95 southbound exit ramp to Boynton Beach Boulevard will be required to stop on red at the temporary traffic signal.
- The westbound inside lane of Boynton Beach Boulevard over the SFRTA Railroad will be closed to perform repairs. Two lanes on westbound Boynton Beach Boulevard will remain open and be shifted to the outside shoulder.



WORK ZONE SAFETY REMINDERS

- With additional traffic expected through the winter season, please proceed with caution through the work zone, drive safely, expect delays, allow additional travel time, and seek alternate routes as needed.
- Lane and ramp closures will also continue for construction activities and ramp widening operations during this time. Please visit the project website for additional lane closure and project information.
