SR 9/I-95 NB EXIT RAMP AT SR 706/INDIANTOWN ROAD—MAR. 2025/APR. 2025 PROGRESS REPORT

Thursday, Apr. 10, 2025 marks contract day 528 of 625, with work 84% completed. Project improvements include milling and resurfacing the existing roadway, widening the Indiantown Road Bridge over the C-18 canal (located just west of Island Way) in both directions to provide an additional through lane, and realigning the I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road to a new signalized intersection. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES ANTICIPATED IN APRIL 2025

- Continue Wrong Way Detection systems installation at the I-95 exit ramps
- Continue curb, gutter and sidewalk installation on eastbound and westbound Indiantown Road, including upgrades to curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards
- Continue median work on the C-18 Canal Bridge on Indiantown Road
- Continue final asphalt paving and striping operations on the I-95 ramps and Indiantown Road

FULL RAMP CLOSURES SUNDAY THROUGH THURSDAY NIGHTS, 10 P.M. TO 6 A.M., AS NEEDED

PLEASE SEE LOCATIONS BELOW—ONLY ONE RAMP TO CLOSE AT A TIME

- I-95 southbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road; **Detour**—The I-95 southbound exit ramp to westbound Indiantown Road to U-turn at the light for eastbound Indiantown Road.
- I-95 southbound entrance ramp from eastbound Indiantown Road; **Detour**—Eastbound Indiantown Road to Island Way to U-turn at the light to head westbound on Indiantown Road to I-95 southbound.
- Indiantown Road westbound to I-95 northbound entrance ramp; **Detour**—Westbound Indiantown Road towards Florida's Turnpike interchange to U-turn at the light to head eastbound on Indiantown Road to access I-95 northbound.
- Indiantown Road westbound to I-95 southbound entrance ramp; **Detour**—Westbound Indiantown Road towards Florida's Turnpike interchange to U-turn at the light to head eastbound on Indiantown Road to access I-95 southbound.
- I-95 southbound exit ramp to westbound Indiantown Road; **Detour**—The I-95 southbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road towards Island Way to U-turn at the light to head westbound on Indiantown Road.
- I-95 northbound exit ramp to eastbound Indiantown Road; **Detour**—The I-95 northbound exit ramp to Donald Ross Road, eastbound to Military Trail, then northbound to Indiantown Road. The I-95 northbound exit ramp to westbound Indiantown Road will also remain open during this time.
- I-95 northbound exit ramp to westbound Indiantown Road; **Detour**—traffic will be detoured via the I-95 northbound exit ramp eastbound to Island Way to U-turn at the light to head westbound on Indiantown Road.

WORK COMPLETED IN MARCH 2025

- Installed and connected the fiber optic cable to Palm Beach County's Traffic System to coordinate with traffic signals along the Indiantown Road corridor, and installed street lighting elements on Indiantown Road
- New traffic signals and mast arms installed and activated at the Island Way intersection
- Completed all drainage installation throughout the project limits
- Completed the extension of the eastbound turn lane to the I-95 northbound entrance ramp, the eastbound turn lane to northbound Island Way, and the median separators at Island Way & 67th Road North
