



Project Overview

- Purpose: Routine preventative maintenance
- Project Length: 540 feet
- Project Duration: 80 days (plus holidays and weather days)
- Bridge Closure: 60 days
- Estimated Completion: Late Fall 2020
- Construction Cost: \$802,818
- Contractor: Seminole Equipment, Inc.





Project Improvements



- Remove and the structural steel coating
- Paint the steel and concrete portions of the bascule bridge over the Boca Raton Inlet (Intracoastal Waterway)
- Paint the open steel roadway and sidewalk
- Adjust movable bridge counterweight
- Clean and paint the bridge's concrete barriers, deck, overhang and bridge tender house

Proposed Color of the Bridge

SR A1A Final Color to be Federal Color Standard 595B No. 15052 (used on FDOT D4 US-27/I-75 Interchange Bridge (see below)



Traffic Impacts




- Bridge will be closed during painting operations a maximum of 60 days
- Vehicle and pedestrian traffic impacted
- The Department is providing a monetary incentive to reduce closure time
- Traffic will be detoured to Federal Highway via Palmetto Park Road and Hillsboro Boulevard
- Marine traffic will continue to have access through the navigable channel. Channel restrictions may occur.

What to Expect



- Detour and work zone signage will be installed north and south of the bridge work zone
- Construction hours are weekdays between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.
- Complete seal of work zone (above and below bridge deck) •
- Safe and controlled work area prevents paint materials and dust from entering the air
- Aids in noise control •
- Painting activities will not encroach into the waterway

Dust Control and Air Quality Monitoring

- Monitoring occurs when an operation is likely to produce dust
- Measures dust levels in surrounding air to ensure that they are kept within acceptable levels (US EPA 40 CFR 50)
- Monitors are placed in strategic locations that are most sensitive to dust and downwind of the painting operation to ensure that emissions are being properly controlled
