The City of Delray Beach, as Project Sponsor, requested that the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four design and construct the Homewood Boulevard Improvements Project through application to the Palm Beach Transportation Planning Agency, Palm Beach County Resolution 2021-0169, and City of Delray Beach Resolution 06-18. FDOT is pleased to assist the County and City with completing these improvements, and will host a Virtual Public Meeting and an In-person Construction Open House on Wednesday, November 3, 2021. The Virtual Public Meeting will take place from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., with the In-person Construction Open House to follow from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Please see below for detailed meeting information.


Construction Cost: \$2,505,477.79 Construction Start: November 12, 2021 Estimated Completion: Early 2023

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Milling and resurfacing the roadway with minor widening
- Concrete sidewalk and driveway replacement, including curb and gutter improvements
- Signing and pavement marking upgrades, including bike lane and detectable warning surfaces
- Installation of four (4) signal mast arms at the Linton Boulevard intersection to meet current standards
- Drainage and utility improvements

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Construction will occur in phases to minimize impacts to the public
- In compliance with the City of Delray Beach Noise Ordinance, work will take place during daytime hours, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- Lane closures are permitted Monday through Friday,
 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Pedestrian, driveway and street access will be maintained at all times
