## NW MILNER DRIVE BETWEEN CR 712/ MIDWAY ROAD AND NW OMEGA ROAD TO CLOSE FOR DRAINAGE WORK ON SEPT. 2

Beginning at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 2, 2025, NW Milner Drive at CR 712/Midway Road will be closed around-the-clock through 5 p.m., Friday, Sept. 19, 2025, for drainage work. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. If weather or unforeseen circumstances occur, NW Milner Drive will reopen by Friday, Sept. 26, 2025.

- Southbound NW Milner Drive motorists will be detoured via westbound CR 712/Midway Road, southbound NW Corporate Way, eastbound NW Corporate Way and southbound NW Milner Drive.
- Northbound NW Milner Drive motorists will be detoured via westbound NW Corporate Way and northbound Corporate Way to CR 712/Midway Road.
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained.
