NIGHTLY CLOSURE OF C.R. 606/OSLO ROAD FROM 66TH AVENUE SW TO 58TH AVENUE SW EXTENDED THROUGH DEC. 23, 2025

To ensure community and public safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, C.R. 606/Oslo Road between 66th Avenue SW and 58th Avenue SW may be closed nightly, 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, through Tuesday, Dec. 23, 2025, for drainage work. Sunday, Jan. 4 through Thursday, Jan. 8, 2026, will be used as contingency nights if needed.

- Westbound C.R. 606/Oslo Road motorists will be detoured via northbound 58th Avenue SW, westbound 1st Street SW and southbound 66th Avenue SW to C.R. 606/Oslo Road.
- Eastbound C.R. 606/Oslo Road motorists will be detoured via northbound 66th Avenue SW, eastbound 1st Street SW and southbound 58th Avenue SW to C.R. 606/Oslo Road.
