
SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard Widening Project

Full Closure of SW Thrift Avenue at SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard extended through July 25, 2025

To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, SW Thrift Avenue at SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard, will be closed around-the-clock through approximately 5 p.m., Friday, July 25, 2025, for roadway reconstruction. This closure was implemented on Monday, March 31. If weather or unforeseen circumstances arise, SW Thrift Avenue will reopen by Friday, August 1.

- Northbound and southbound SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard to eastbound SW Thrift Avenue motorists will be detoured via SW Tulip Boulevard and SW Voyager Street to SW Thrift Avenue.
- Westbound SW Thrift Avenue motorists will be detoured via SW Voyager Street and SW Tulip Boulevard to SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard
