FULL CLOSURE OF SW TROUVILLE AVENUE AT PORT ST.LUCIE BOULEVARD EXTENDED THROUGH JULY 25, 2025

To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer, more resilient infrastructure, SW Trouville Avenue at SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard will be closed around-the-clock beginning at 5 p.m., Saturday, June 7, 2025, through approximately 5 p.m., Friday, July 25, for roadway reconstruction. If weather or unforeseen circumstances arise, SW Trouville Avenue will reopen by Friday, August 1, 2025.

- Northbound and southbound SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard to eastbound SW Trouville Avenue will be detoured to eastbound SW Tulip Boulevard to southbound SW Voyager Street to westbound SW Trouville Avenue
- Westbound SW Trouville Avenue motorists will be detoured to northbound SW Voyager Street to westbound SW Tulip Boulevard to SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard
