



Full Closure of SW Tulip Boulevard at SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard extended through May 23

To ensure community and crew safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, SW Tulip Boulevard at SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard, will be closed around-the-clock through approximately 5 p.m., Friday, May 23, for roadway reconstruction. This closure was first implemented on March 31. If weather or unforeseen circumstances arise, SW Tulip Boulevard will reopen by Friday, May 30.

- Northbound and southbound SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard to eastbound SW Tulip Boulevard motorists will be detoured via SW Trouville Avenue and SW Voyager Street to SW Tulip Boulevard.
- Westbound SW Tulip Boulevard motorists will be detoured via SW Voyager Street and SW Trouville Avenue to SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard.
