## NIGHTLY CLOSURE OF SR 656/17<sup>th</sup> STREET BRIDGE FOR TRAFFIC SEPARATOR MAINTENANCE BEGINS SEPT. 15, 2025

To ensure community and public safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, eastbound and westbound traffic on SR 656/17th Street Bridge between SR A1A and SR 60/Indian River Boulevard, will be closed to traffic nightly, 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Monday through Friday, beginning Monday, September 15, through Friday, September 19, for traffic separator maintenance throughout the bridge. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. Monday, September 22, through Friday, September 26, will be used as contingency dates if needed.

- Westbound motorists will be detoured via SR A1A and SR 60/Beachland Boulevard to SR 60/Indian River Boulevard.
- Eastbound motorists will be detoured via SR 60/Indian River Boulevard and SR 60/Beachland Boulevard to SR A1A.
