NORTHBOUND SR 60/INDIAN RIVER BOULEVARD CLOSED FOR OVERNIGHT ROADWAY WORK ON AUGUST 17, 2025

Northbound SR 60/Indian River Boulevard, just north of Royal Palm Pointe, will be closed at night, Sunday, August 17, 2025, from 8:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m., for roadway reconstruction. Signage will be in place to assist motorists. If weather or unforeseen circumstances occur, northbound SR 60/Indian River Boulevard will reopen by Monday, August 18, 2025.

- Northbound SR 60/Indian River-Boulevard motorists will be detoured via westbound SR 60/20th Street, SR 60/20th Place, northbound SR 5/US 1 and eastbound 37th Street to Indian River Boulevard.
- Northbound SR 5/US 1 motorists from Royal Palm Pointe must follow the detour via southbound SR 60/Indian River Boulevard, SR 60/20th Street, westbound SR 60/20th Place, northbound SR 5/US 1 and eastbound 37th Street to Indian River Boulevard.
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained.
