

TRAFFIC DETOUR OF CR 712/ MIDWAY ROAD BETWEEN MILNER DRIVE AND SELVITZ ROAD, SEPTEMBER 5-8, 2025

To ensure community and public safety as we work to enhance the roadway and provide a safer and more resilient infrastructure, CR 712/Midway Road from approximately 2,500 feet east of Milner Drive to approximately 1,400 feet west of Selvitz Road, will be closed around-the-clock beginning at 9 p.m. on Friday, September 5, 2025, through 5 a.m. on Monday, September 8, 2025, for drainage work. If weather or unforeseen circumstances occur, the detour will take place on Friday, September 12, through Monday, September 14. Signage will be in place to assist motorists.

- Eastbound CR 712/Midway Road motorists will be detoured via northeast on Glades Cut Off Road, southbound on Selvitz Road to CR 712/Midway Road.
- Westbound CR 712/Midway Road motorists will be detoured via northbound on Selvitz Road, southwest on Glades Cut Off Road to CR 712/Midway Road.
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained.
