


FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SR 9/I-95 TRAFFIC SHIFT NOTICE

State Road (SR) 9/I-95 at County Road (CR) 606/Oslo Road New Interchange and CR 606/Oslo Road Widening Project SR 9/I-95 at CR 606/Oslo Road and CR 606/Oslo Road from west of SR 9/I-95 to SW 58th Avenue Indian River County, Florida Financial Project IDs: 413048-2-52-01 and 431521-1-52-01

SR 9/I-95 NORTHBOUND AND SOUTHBOUND TRAFFIC TO BE TEMPORARILY SHIFTED NIGHTLY THROUGH AUG. 2025

As part of the SR 9/I-95 at County Road (CR) 606/Oslo Road New Interchange and CR 606/Oslo Road Widening Project, crews will implement a traffic shift by reducing the three-lane section of SR 9/I-95 in each direction to one lane between Indrio Road (Exit 138) and SR 60/20th Street (Exit 147). This lane reduction will take place nightly from Sunday to Thursday, 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., through Sunday, Aug. 31, for bridge demolition work. One lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained via two constructed crossover lanes to facilitate the traffic shift. This reduction is necessary to safely perform roadway work, and bridge demolition work. If weather or unforeseen circumstances occur, the shifts will continue through Friday, Sept. 5.

- Northbound motorists on SR 9/I-95 will be shifted to the southbound lanes at CR 606/Oslo Road bridge using a new crossover lane during bridge demolition work.
- Southbound motorists on SR 9/1-95 will be shifted to the northbound lanes at CR 606/Oslo Road bridge using a new crossover lane during bridge demolition work.
- To ensure motorist and crew safety, the speed limit will be reduced from 70 MPH to 35 MPH. The Florida Highway Patrol will be onsite, and signage will be in place to assist motorists.
