## State Road (SR) 5/US 1 Resurfacing Project Information Flyer

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is pleased to provide information regarding the State Road (SR) 5/US 1 Resurfacing Project in the City of Sebastian. The project limits are on SR 5/US 1 from Davis Street to the south end of the Sebastian Inlet Bridge (No. 700224) over the St. Sebastian River. This project aims to enhance safety, resiliency, and longevity of the infrastructure in our communities. Please see below for detailed project information.

Construction Cost: \$5.7 million Construction Start: September 2024 Estimated Completion: Summer 2025

#### **PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS**

- Milling and resurfacing the existing roadway within project limits to ensure long-term resilience
- Safety is the Department's top priority and is embedded in all that we do. Safety improvements include:
  - Reconstructing existing sidewalk curb ramps to meet current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards to improve accessibility
  - Installing sidewalks at the northern end of the project limits to enhance accessibility and pedestrian safety
  - Upgrading lighting to better illuminate pedestrian crosswalks at signalized intersections
  - Installing pedestrian countdown signal features at signalized intersections to enhance pedestrian safety
  - Upgrading signage and pavement markings to improve visibility to motorists

## TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Single-lane closures on SR 5/US 1 are permitted nightly, Sunday through Thursday, 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m., and will not exceed the distance of two consecutive signalized intersections.
- To ensure motorist and crew safety, around-the-clock single-lane closures are permitted at various locations on SR 5/US 1 for eight consecutive days during specific construction phases; advanced notice will be provided.
- Sections of sidewalk will be closed one side at a time to maintain pedestrian traffic. Sidewalk closures may not exceed two blocks at a time.
- Access to and from bus stops should be maintained.
  In the event that access cannot be maintained,
  advanced notice will be provided.
