Mast Arm Installation at Mediterranean Blvd. N to occur night of Thursday, Sept. 2, 2021

Mediterranean Blvd. N, just east of US 1, will undergo a full closure from approximately 8 p.m. until 12 a.m. Thursday night, Sept. 2, 2021 for new mast arm installation.

During this time, motorists may detour via US 1, Mediterranean Blvd. S., Silver Oak Dr., and Mediterranean Blvd. N.

This work is part of the US 1/SR 5 project, from south of SR 716 to Rio Mar Drive. Work on this project includes: milling and resurfacing the existing roadway; restriping to provide 6-foot buffered bicycle lanes; upgrading pedestrian signals, detectors and lighting at signalized intersections; and upgrading sidewalk and curb ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements.
